Follow the schedules below for curbside pickup.

Please put your recycling curbside after 5:00 PM the day before pickup or before 6:00 AM on pickup day. After collections, remove empty barrels and crates from the curb by midnight.

During leaf season, do not place barrels in the street.

RIDGEWOOD RECYCLING CENTER

The Recycling Center operates as a drive-thru/drop-off and we accept almost everything mentioned in this brochure, except for the items that contain other handling instructions. Please have materials properly separated, in the trunk of your vehicle, and follow instructions from our attendant. To dispose of yard waste at the recycling center please have proof of residency. Any plastic bags of vegetative waste brought to the Recycling Center must be opened and emptied into the truck by residents. Garbage is never accepted at the recycling center. Thank you, and we look forward to welcoming you soon!

The RECYCLING Barrel

Commingled Cans & Bottles

Empty • Rinse • Keep items loose (do not bag)



Remember: Always use the barrel issued by Ridgewood Recycling for curbside pickup of cans & bottles.



Plastic Jugs



Plastic Bottles



Plastic Dairy Tubs/Lids



Plastic Jars



Cartons
(e.g., soup, juice, milk, broth, wine, beans)



Glass Bottles & Jars



Metal Cans, Aluminum Foil, Small Metal Food Trays, Metal Lids (over 2")

NO

- Foam from eggs crates, trays, or packaging
- Plastic from bakery, produce, deli, food trays, cups, or utensils
- Cushioning/insulation from produce or grocery delivery boxes



Paper & Cardboard

Tie or neatly stack cardboard • Place next to barrel
Put paper in Village crate, paper bag, or cardboard box

Paper & Cardboard

- Cardboard boxes & paper bags
- Mail, envelopes, office & writing paper
- Newsprint
- Magazines & catalogs



Remember:

Papers can be mixed at the curbside only. Paper must still be separate from cardboard at the Recycling Center.

Clean, Dry, & Stacked

Wind & rain are problems for recyclables. You can help by putting items out early on collection morning or by taking them to the center. Never use the recycling barrel for paper & cardboard.



On Curbside Bulk Days

Keep these items separate from bulk trash

Recycle Appliances, Automobile Batteries, Metal Objects & Tires

Remember:

- Remove refrigerator doors
- No large truck or heavy machinery tires
- Poles and pipes should not be longer than 4 feet
- Deliver gas-powered lawn equipment to the recycling center (drain oils and fluids first)



Vegetative Waste Pickup

Accepted at the Recycling Center • Curbside pickup available from **April 7-October 10** • Place items in a barrel or brown paper lawn/leaf bag



RULES: Place grass clippings and brush in a barrel (no larger than 32 gallons or heavier than 80 pounds), or in a paper biodegradable lawn/leaf bag. Branches (up to 3 feet in length and 2 inches in diameter – no logs) should be bundled and tied. All items must be placed at the curb. No plastic bags or Village recycling barrels will be picked up.

What about leaves? Beginning on October 13, leaves are to be placed directly in the street in accordance with the schedule for your respective area. A schedule and instructions will be sent to your home in October. Branches/brush will not be collected curbside during leaf collection season, but may be brought to the Recycling Center.

Recycling Center
Limit: One 32 gallon barrel of material. (No contractors, no asphalt, no colored concrete, no red brick, no ceramics)



E-Waste (TVs, PCs, etc)

| Recycling Center



Hard covered books
(that cannot be donated)

Remove & discard covers. Package innards of books with papers for recycling.



Household batteries

Throw alkaline batteries away. Give button cell and dry-cell rechargeable batteries weighing up to 11 lbs. (and 300 Wh for Li-ion) to the recycling center attendant. First, tape the terminal ends with non-conductive tape.
