PRC Board to support this ballot question.

RBSA/Hawes Field:

S. Muller shared that Upper and Lower Hawes are VOR property not BOE property. Last year, lower Hawes was remediated. The VOR was able to replace the backstop at lower Hawes. RBSA reached out to the sports company that renovated on lower Hawes to completely renovate upper Hawes. RBSA would like to gift the VOR \$56,300.00 for remediation of upper Hawes. This is planned to be accomplished on November 6 and 7, when school is closed for NJEA Convention. RBSA is requesting support from the PRC Board. Approved with motions by D. Sayles, J. Morgan made a second motion. All in favor. This gift donation will be sent to the Village Council for acceptance.
